## Feedback and Concerns with the Landlord Fairness Code Initiative

#### General Feedback

- Will have success if written properly and includes different perspectives. Precision is needed.
- During the meeting it was notices folks didn't feel included in the broader discussion.
- There is a need for collaboration and building bridges by looking for common ground.
- Helpful to make the protected pool broader. The more inclusive it becomes the more folks won't feel as "divisive."
- Concern with the financialization of property as only a capitalist investment. Need a
  discussion to help us focus on the greed of corporate property owners and the
  relationship to increasing homelessness as well as best ways to deal fairly with issues
  surrounding eviction.
- Decision makers need data to shape their choices—they prefer to see what's happening
  in other places, seeing its impacts before implementing wide protections.
- Relocation assistance and fee caps are wonderful. The educator protections is novel, and interesting. There are other jurisdictions (Seattle) that have the winter eviction protections, so that's worth learning from.
- I-35 in Seattle passed this is part of a national movement. How successful has it been in the other jurisdictions?
- Competing motivations: popular rhetoric vs. legal language.

Curious of elaboration regarding different populations being represented?

## **Concerns Mentioned**

- Housing providers aren't excited about it and there will be pushback.
- There are jursidictions in other places that have winter eviction restrictions, and we know how that works. Seattle has it. Some will say it does work, some will say it doesn't.
- Laws and regulations that are already in place should not be reiterated due to cluttered language. It makes it sound like those regulations are not already in place.
- Sticking point paying for rent relocation.
- Concerns about laws already in place that aren't being followed/enforced.
- Concerns about legal challenges to this. Could it survive? Is it overly ambitious?
- Concerns were raised about the inability to evict when groups like LASA have had some tenants who have not paid in 2 years even with section 8 that keyed to income.
- Some overlap with COT's landlord-renter work. The city's success in this space has come from dedicated effort to work with landlords on the process.
- Make an effort to let smaller landlords know what won't impact them, but be aware that when landlord resistance does arise, it comes from both large and small landlords.
- Would this be a problem for service providers?
- What about other bad actors (such as DV)? Would this possible exacerbate existing issues?
- This doesn't actually address the issue of insufficient housing, and might dissuade future landlords from renting out space on their personal property, etc.
- Need more exemptions for small landlords.
- Worry about others not getting the opportunity (not a unanimous position).
- Rent stabilization is essential, but many questions about eviction policies.
